
St Mary's Priory & Christchurch and Holy Trinity, Abergavenny, St Peter's, Llanwenarth Citra August 30 - Trinity 12 (Proper 17)

Having earned plaudits from Jesus in last week's Gospel Reading for recognising Him as the Messiah, Peter again speaks in this week's reading – but this time is rebuked by Jesus.

We should not criticise Peter. Having been told that the leader whom he admires and loves is the Messiah, he is then told that the Messiah has to go to Jerusalem, suffer and be put to death. Possibly the shock of this was so great that he did not hear the point about being raised after three days. It is therefore understandable that he cannot believe that this will happen.

The rebuke by Jesus is harsh, possibly because in the shock and love expressed by Peter, he saw temptation to avoid suffering, hence the reference to Satan.

Jesus continues by telling the disciples what is required to be one of His followers. The words of Paul to the church at Rome in our New Testament reading tell us what is required of us in our daily lives when we accept that task.
